

# **Daily Currency Outlook**

### **USD/MYR**

## Intraday Thoughts - MYR Neutral

USD/MYR opened little changed at 4.4855. The pair will likely stay constrained by the 4.4900 resistance, hanging on to the 4.4800 levels. USD outlook remains bullish overall although the softer US job gain has pared expectations of a 75bps rate hike at this month's FOMC meeting. Amid expectations for sustained USD strength, we expect the pair to continue trading on a slightly bullish note testing the 4.49 stronghold, a break above 4.4900 may send the pair to the historical record of 4.50. Expectation for a 25bps OPR hike at this week's BNM MPC meeting is believed to have been priced in and hence, unlikely to have any significant influence on the MYR.

#### 1-Month Outlook - MYR Neutral

Despite expectation for sustained USD strength, USD/ MYR is expected to continue trading at current ranges, supported by further domestic economic recovery and ongoing BNM policy normalization. Growth is expected to pick up further in 3Q suprred by continuous robust domestic consumption and a low base effect in 3Q last year, allowing BNM to continue normalizing monetary policy, by a further 50bps to 2.75% by year end in our view. This should help alleviate some pressure on the MYR given widnening negative yield differentials with US rates as the Fed looks committed to further policy tightening to combat inflation despite an engineered slowdown in growth.

# SGD/MYR



### SGD/MYR Neutral

SGD/MYR opened little changed at 3.1967 and was seen hovering at 3.1991 at time of writing. We are neutral on SGD/MYR outlook today as both the MYR and SGD are expected to trade sideways following the slight pullback in the USD last Friday. In the medium term, increasing external headwinds are expected to dampen Singapore's growth prospects as the Fed is expected to be relatively hawkish compared to the MAS which is likely to tighten policy in October.

### **GBP/MYR**



#### **GBP/MYR Bearish**

GBP/MYR opened 0.57% lower at 5.1518, tracking extended weakness in the GBP/ USD. The sterling remained under selling pressure against the allencompassing dollar strength, trading just above the psychological level of 1.1500. Weak UK fundamentals and a relatively less hawkish BOE vis-à-vis the Fed and ECB are expected to reinforce GBP bears, testing the critical support of 1.1400.

### **AUD/MYR**



#### AUD/MYR Neutral-to-Slightly Bearish

AUD/MYR opened 0.18% lower at 3.0497. We remain neutral to slightly bearish on AUD/MYR, as the sour risk sentiment weighs on commodities and commodity-linked currencies. AUD downsides are driven by the expectations for a less aggressive RBA rate hike vis-à-vis the Fed, and weaker Chinese growth outlook but should be more resilient compared to EUR, GBP and JPY.
